HALLOWEEN SAFETY TIPS

With witches, goblins, and super-heroes descending on neighborhoods, here are some safety tips to help prepare your children for a safe and enjoyable trick or treat night.

- Children should watch for moving vehicles when crossing streets.

- Trick or Treaters should dress appropriately for the weather and carry a flashlight.
